Participant Eligibility

Ancestry

Participants must identify as Indigenous, including Metis, First Nations or Inuit

Age Categories

Students enrolled in grades 7 through 12 are eligible to participate. Winners will be selected in each of the age categories below for each gender (male and female):

- 13U: Ages 11-13
- 16U: Ages 14-16
- 19U: Ages 17-19

*age categories are based on participants age as of May 14, 2021.

IMPORTANT NOTE:

We encourage Physical Education Specialists to engage their entire classes in these events, not only those of Indigenous ancestry. However, please only submit results for those who identify as Metis, First Nations or Inuit.

Event Setup

- This event can be held with all age categories/genders at once, or separately, whatever is easiest for you. Remember to score each age category and gender separately.
- Competition can be held indoors, or outdoors
- Each shooting spot must be clearly marked on the court (Tape, pylon, dot, etc.)
 - Shooting spots are outlined in the diagram below “Scoring”

Event Participation

The MIG 2021 Basketball Challenge will consist of both male and female individual events for 13U, 16U, and 19U age categories. There is an unlimited amount of participants in each age category, gender (male/female), and equipment division.

Equipment

- Minimum 9.5ft Basketball Hoop
- Basketballs
- Stop Watch

Competition Format

- 2-minute maximum to get as many points as you can by completing baskets from various spots on the court
- Each spot is worth a different amount of points
- The shooter can use a maximum of 2 balls, and has the help of a rebounder

Competition Rules

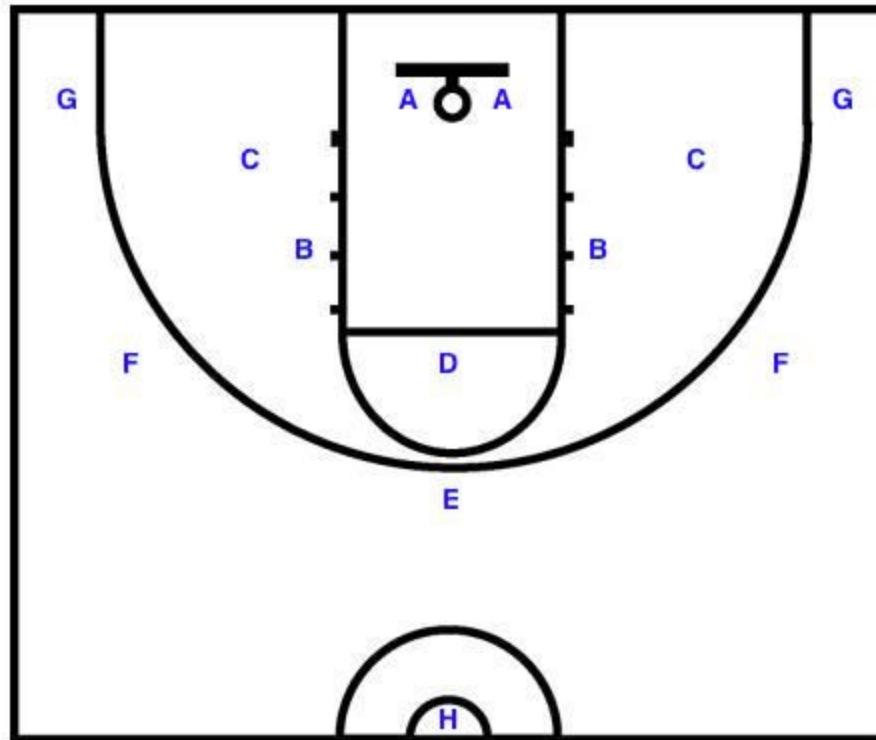
- Maximum of 2-minutes to get as many points as you can
- Maximum 2 balls, 1 shooter and 1 rebounder
- Maximum of 20 total points (4 successful baskets) may be awarded for the “A” position

IMPORTANT NOTE:

The competition format and competition rules are subject to change. This is due to whatever protocols are in place regarding shared equipment, at the time of competition in May 2021.

Scoring

- Collect as many points as you can by making baskets from the various shooting spots on the court
- Scoring is as follows:
 - A - 5 points
 - B - 10 points
 - C - 15 points
 - D - 20 points
 - E - 25 points
 - F - 30 points
 - G - 35 points
 - H - 50 points



Tie Breaking Rule

School/Group Level

In the event of a tie at the school/group level, the following steps shall be followed to declare a winner:

1. Greatest number of 50's
2. Greatest number of 35's
3. Greatest number of 30's, etc.

Provincial Level (MASRC)

In the event of a tie when ranking provincially, the following steps shall be followed to declare a winner:

1. Greatest number of 50's
2. Greatest number of 35's
3. Greatest number of 30's, etc.

HOW TO USE SCORECARD:

1. Have the participant fill out the information at the top of the scorecard.
2. During the participants turn, mark each successful shot in the correct row with lines (III = 5)
3. Multiply Successful shots column by points = total for that row (example above)
4. Add together all the totals for a grand total
5. Submit results by May 19, 2021

Awards

All participants of the MIG 2021 Basketball Challenge event across Manitoba will be ranked based on their scoring. A gold, silver and bronze medal will be given to the first, second and third place participants (respectively) in each age category and gender.
