2003 – **NAHC** #2 - Two arenas will be used for the 2003 NAHC. The A'nowara'ko:wa Arena, located on Cornwall Island, is a state of the art facility built by Akwesasne seven (7) years ago. The 39,000 square foot arena is designed in the shape of a turtle. It has an NHL size ice surface and seats 2,500 spectators. Immediately across the river from the A'nowara'ko:wa Arena is the Cornwall Civic Complex and Convention Centre. It is located in Cornwall's downtown core. The complex has an NHL size rink, which seats up to 5,500 spectators.

2002 – NAHC #1 - First Nation teams from Saskatchewan to New Brunswick competed in the 7-day tournament. Akwesasne hosted the first ever National Aboriginal Hockey Championships. Two northern Ontario teams competed in the tournament. The Ontario North Males took the bronze medal as they defeated the Ontario South team (coached by Ted Nolan) by a score of 8-6. North came back from a 6-3 deficit and ended up winning the game by five straight third period goals. The Ontario Female team lost in the bronze medal game to Saskatchewan by a score of 5-4. Both Northern Ontario teams ended up with a record of 2-3 in the round robin. Gold medals were won by Team Manitoba on the Male side and Ontario South on the Female side. Four Northern Ontario players got chosen to participate in the National Aboriginal Training Camp which will be held in Thunder Bay, Ontario on July 2 – 8, 2002.
