"Elle Wood is a proud Métis student at St. Mary's Academy in grade 11 with an over $90 \%$ average in her studies. She does her best to be involved in the community and in her high school. She acts on important issues at St. Mary's Academy where she is the co-head of the Mission Club, a member of the Mental Health Day planning committee (focus on grade 10s), a Peer Support classroom presenter, a Model United Nations delegate, and member of the Wellbeing Committee. This year she also had the privilege to peer mentor a student in grade seven. One of her biggest accomplishments this year was organizing the Water With Blessings fundraiser to help increase access to clean water for people in Kenya raising over \$1,500.

Elle plays on her high school varsity volleyball team, runs on her high school varsity cross country team, and is a member of the high school's golf team. For her club volleyball team, she was Captain and led her team to win a bronze at Nationals for
Tier 1, Division 3 (May 2022).
