Team Manitoba / 2008 NAIG



The North American Indigenous Games (NAIG) is North America's largest Aboriginal sporting event which will be taking place this year in Cowichan, BC in August of 2008. The Manitoba Aboriginal Sport and Recreation Council with help from the sport managers and coaches, has organized try outs to select the 500 Team Manitoba athletes who will have the honour to represent Manitoba at this most prestigious event. In total, there will be over 5000 athletes competing in the games along with 3000 cultural participants gathering

for support. Team Manitoba, which is made up of 12 sports in the bantam, midget and juvenile age categories will be sending a delegation of over 500 athletes and coaches to the games. These sports include athletics, archery, badminton, baseball (male only), basketball, canoe, golf, lacrosse (male only), soccer, softball, swimming and volleyball. Team Manitoba is currently in the final stages of completing the rosters for the 2008 NAIG. A total of 1000 athletes attended the try outs and I.D. camps across the province to represent Team Manitoba going to NAIG.

Senior Sports for NAIG

Manitoba Aboriginal Sport and Recreation Council have recently announced that Team Manitoba will be including the senior category to compete in the 2008 North American Indigenous Games. Teams are in the process of being selected and practices are underway. MASRC will endorse the participation of 8 senior sports, male and female. Sports that are included are Archery, Athletics, Badminton, Golf, Canoeing, Volleyball, Basketball and Swimming. Senior athletes are responsible for their own organization, travel, meals and accommodations to and from Cowichan, BC for NAIG 2008. MASRC is willing to provide fundraising and planning tips for those who are interested. Senior teams are dependant on the amount of interest and competition from other provinces.

The 2008 National Aboriginal Hockey Championships (NAHC) will be held this year in Sault St. Marie, Ontario. The NAHC provides a forum for elite Aboriginal hockey players throughout Canada. Team Manitoba is represented by two teams, one male and one female which are both comprised of the bantam and midget age athletes from across Manitoba. Darryl Bauer, the NAHC Team

Manager seems confident about the 2008 Female Team, "this year we held try-outs in the summer, allowing the girls to come together and build team chemistry early, because of this, our team is looking strong and we definitely have an advantage over the other teams." The team is expected to do well in the championships; they are a strong favourite and have great talent. Tara Lacquette, this year's Team Manitoba goalie is already making history, she is playing for Both the Aboriginal Provincial team and the Team Manitoba Program of excellence. "Lacquette is the starting goalie for both programs, which is probably the first time a player has ever played and started for both teams." – Peter Symchuck, Team Manager. Manitoba's recipients for the 2007 Aboriginal Coach Award will be invited to receive their award at the 21st Annual Coaching Manitoba Excellence Awards Brunch, which will be held on April 12, 2008 at the Hilton Suites Winnipeg Airport. All regional recipients of these awards will automatically advance as nominees for the Aboriginal Sport Circle's prestigious National Award that is presented to the most outstanding male and female Aboriginal Athlete and Coach in Canada.


