



U19 Softball athletes Hope Ransome and Finley Folkett have signed to the University of Jamestown (North Dakota) and the University of Southern Maine.






Both athletes are standouts on their team, and currently play for the MN Waves out of the US.

COMMUNITY GROWS LOVE OF HOCKEY AT ALL-INDIGENOUS TOURNAMENT



The Birdtail Sioux Dakota Nation is one of these communities. One of six Dakota nations (Dakota Tipi, Dakota Plains, Sioux Valley, Canupawakpa, Birdtail) living in Manitoba, the community is located almost an hour north of Virden. The community is home to just over 500 on-reserve members.

Last weekend, for the first time ever, the Birdtail Sioux Dakota Nation sent 5 full teams to the tournament! Doug Hanksa Junior, community member and volunteer, has focused on growing the game in his community. Just last year, Birdtail only had 8 hockey players in their whole community. Thanks to Doug, and the work of NAHC alumni Trechelle Bunn, hockey is becoming a mainstay in their community.

Thank you to the Southern Chiefs Organization for sharing their photos and this story with us. The Dakota Nation Winterfest has been a staple for Indigenous Manitobans for over 10 years. Hosted by the Sioux Valley Dakota Nation, the winter event boasts a powwow, super-sized bingo, square dance competitions, basketball and volleyball, and of course, hockey.

Across all ages, communities send the best of the best for a chance to claim one of the Winterfest Hockey Championships championship.


Basketball season is in full swing- and our staff

Robyn Boulanger is currently in her fifth year of playing with The University Of Winnipeg Wesmen women's basketball team. Last year Robyn helped her team to the National Championships, and ultimately won a silver medal. This month, Robyn has made her mark in Canada West, and U Sports history by making her way into the top 10 for threes made in the conference, and into the top spot in U Sports for three-pointers made this season (42). During that same weekend against the no. 1 ranked team Regina Cougars, Robyn had a career high game of 26 points and the first game with 13 points, averaging 24.5 points and 2 steals. The outstanding performance by Robyn has earned her spot as Canada West Player of the Week and also U Sports National Player of the Week!





Outside of basketball, Robyn is an amazing and down to earth person who loves her family and friends and would do anything for the people she loves. Robyn is also an amazing mentor who frequently gives back to the youth on her free time. She's an amazing role model who leads by example, living a healthy and active lifestyle.
